As protests against police violence continue, law enforcement campaign contributions to elected officials have begun to receive scrutiny. Our national database of campaign contributions generates a snapshot of law enforcement donations in local prosecutor elections across the country.

WHY IT MATTERS

Prosecutors work closely with law enforcement. They make decisions about credibility of police and legality of their actions. If a police officer shoots an unarmed civilian, the prosecutor is responsible for deciding whether to bring criminal charges. If the prosecutor has received money from law enforcement, the public may question the legitimacy of those decisions.

The database includes only direct campaign contributions, not independent expenditures, and the affiliation of one third of all money donated was not specified.

As a result, the database likely understates the total amount of law enforcement dollars in prosecutor elections.
